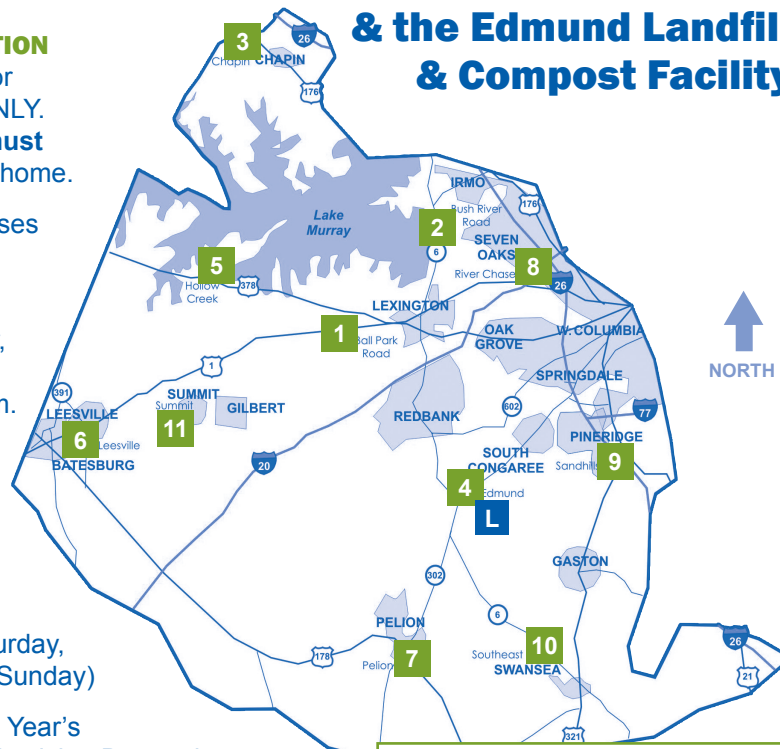

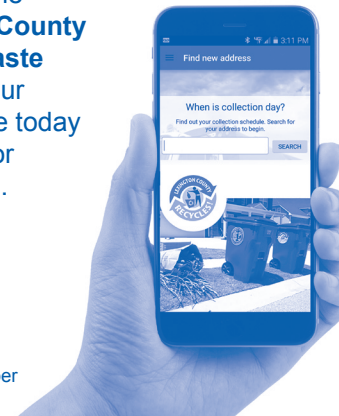
BACKYARD COMPOST BINS

WOOD WASTE, CLEAN (e.g., branches, stumps, pallets, leaves, pine straw, pine cones, Christmas trees) Wood waste is accepted at Ball Park, Bush River, Chapin, Edmund, Sandhills and Southeast Centers.	No	SOME	YES	No	No

* Loads with more than four tires and commercially generated tires are accepted ONLY at the Edmund Landfill. A handling fee will be assessed unless business shows valid ST-390.

Why should we recycle?

- Recycling is good for the economy and creates jobs for people in South Carolina.
- Recycling prevents materials from going into a landfill.
- Recycling saves natural resources like trees and petroleum.

How should items be prepared for recycling?

- Place recyclable material **loosely** in recycling containers – **NOT in plastic bags!** Empty bags get caught in the sorting equipment and full bags prevent the equipment from identifying and sorting the contents.
- Empty and rinse all containers.
- No objects 2 X 2 inches or smaller are accepted.
- Paper labels **do not** need to be removed from glass, plastic or metal.
- When preparing **plastic containers**, if the top screws on, leave it on. If it pops off, take it off (and discard it).
- Keep **paper items** (e.g., cardboard, newspaper) clean and dry.
- **IN CURBSIDE BINS:**
 - Only include 1) plastic containers, 2) metal cans, 3) paper and cardboard, and 4) glass bottles and jars (if allowed in your area).
 - **Flatten** cardboard, cartons and paper, but **do not flatten** cans and bottles. (Discard loose metal lids.)
 - **Do not** include long, thin materials such as hangers or cords.
 - **Do not** include scrap metal or hazardous materials.
- When in doubt, leave it out ... or ask!
